What is Teacher Subject Specialist Training (TSST)?

Our TSST programme is our course designed to improve the knowledge of non-specialists, it is fully funded and is encouraged by many since it enhances delegates' confidence.



Would this a programme you would be interested in supporting? If so, please read below regarding host school eligibility!

How could you become a host school?

- The training is totally free and the school will even receive funding for refreshments and catering.
- You would need to provide a science lab for the training.
- A model is 6 twilight sessions and 2 full days. However, this is flexible around you and your school and could follow other models.
- The sessions include a lot of engaging "hands on" practical work and support with developing subject knowledge of non-specialist physics teachers.
- The twilight sessions can begin at any time you wish and usually last approximately 2 hours. Our course facilitator would need to arrive about 1.5 hours before to set up.
- Dates of the course are totally worked around your school, however you need to commit to providing a core audience of at least 8 teachers for each session.
- Fliers are then created advertising the courses on the STEM website enabling teachers from other school to book places.
- The course facilitator will bring 90% of their own kit to the sessions and just ask the school to provide everyday items such as metre rulers, electrical wires etc.
